Creating a Career Transition Plan



Your career transition will be much more efficient if you set out with a formal mission, vision and goals. These will form the foundation for your plan. Complete page 2 of this worksheet to begin the process.

First, let's define some terms:

Mission: A mission is a reason for being. Your career mission statement consists of the reason(s) that you work.

Example: My career mission is to provide a balance of clinical and nonclinical services that bring joy to my life, provide excellent care to my patients, and outstanding performance to my employer.

Vision: Your vision is a mental image of what the future might be like.

Example: My vision for my career involves working in a very cohesive team, identifying important quality challenges using sophisticated measurement tools, and achieving measurable improvement in quality and financial outcomes.

Goals: Career goals are desired results relative to your job or career. Well written goals are typically "SMART": Specific, Measurable, Actionable, Relevant, Time-limited.

Examples:

I will update my resume and have two of my colleagues critique it for me by the end of September.

I will complete a course on understanding healthcare financials by the end of this year.

I will seek a part- or full-time job as a physician advisor for utilization management, and schedule at least two interviews by the end of November.
